

# Who We're Becoming: A Changing Population in Brooklyn Center

The Brooklyn Center community continues to change, as it diversifies and deepens its multicultural tapestry.

Using data from the 2010 and 2020 Censuses\* and data from the 2010 and 2021 American Community Surveys (ACS), this report outlines key areas of community change over the decade.

\*Due to only partial public availability of 2020 Census data, this report utilized 2021 data where available to measure community change. While there are some collection differences between the Census and ACS, data remains reliable within a minimal margin of error.







## Racial Composition of Each City and Hennepin County At-Large





### Language and Birthplace



## **Share of Population by Age Group**









